In addition to several directorial credits, Daisy created independent film, "Smile: The Documentary," which chronicles the experience of Brooks alumnus Arnez Newton '00 growing up in the inner city of a crime-infested Chicago.

Daisy's recent work includes a collaboration between ESPN's "The Undefeated" and The National Geographic Channel, titled, "The March on Washington: Keepers of the Dream." Prior to joining ESPN Films, Marquis worked at HBO Sports, where he helped to on platforms such as "Inside the NFL," "Costas Now," "Real Sports with Bryant Gumbel," the 24/7 boxing series, as well as documentaries such as "Bird & Magic: A Courtship of Rivals and Namath: From Beaver Falls to Broadway."
