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## Has Your Student Driver Signed Up?

Brooks will be offering a free "Distractology" [workshop](#) for teen drivers who hold a U.S. Learner's Permit, or who have had a license for less than three years, by appointment Tuesday through Saturday. Participants will use a mobile simulator designed to show new drivers how dangerous it is to text and drive. 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## New Student Swim Test on Sept. 5

New students are asked to take a swim test, administered on campus, when they first enter Brooks. This is required for all new students. Students will not be allowed to participate in the sailing or crew programs unless they have passed the swim test. Students who are not proficient swimmers should indicate so and will not be asked to participate in the swim test. The swim test will be administered on Wednesday as part of orientation. Students should bring a bathing suit and towel.
